`<p>` and `<div>` are similar but a blank line appears after a `<p>`. Note that `<div>` stands for division.

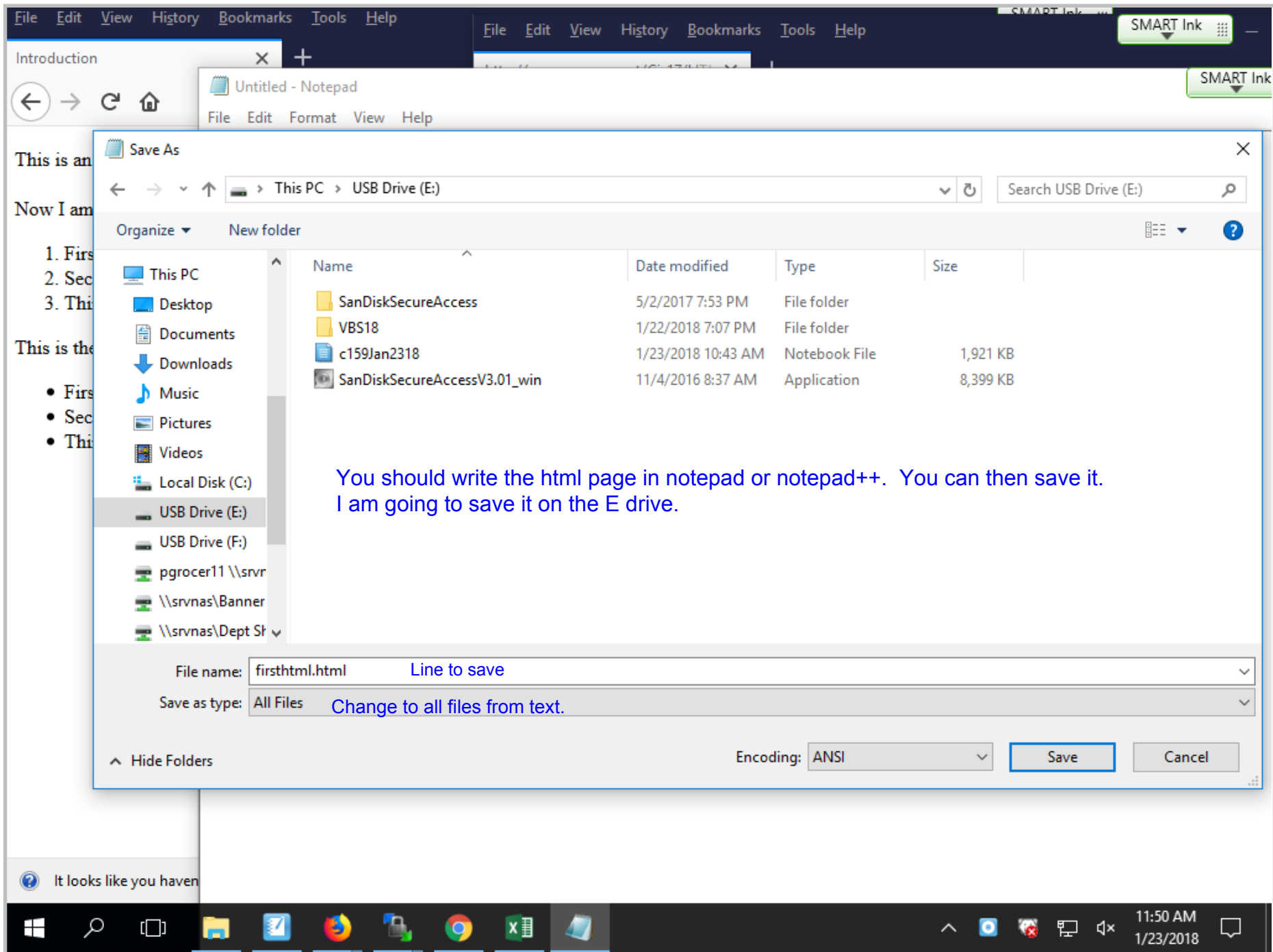

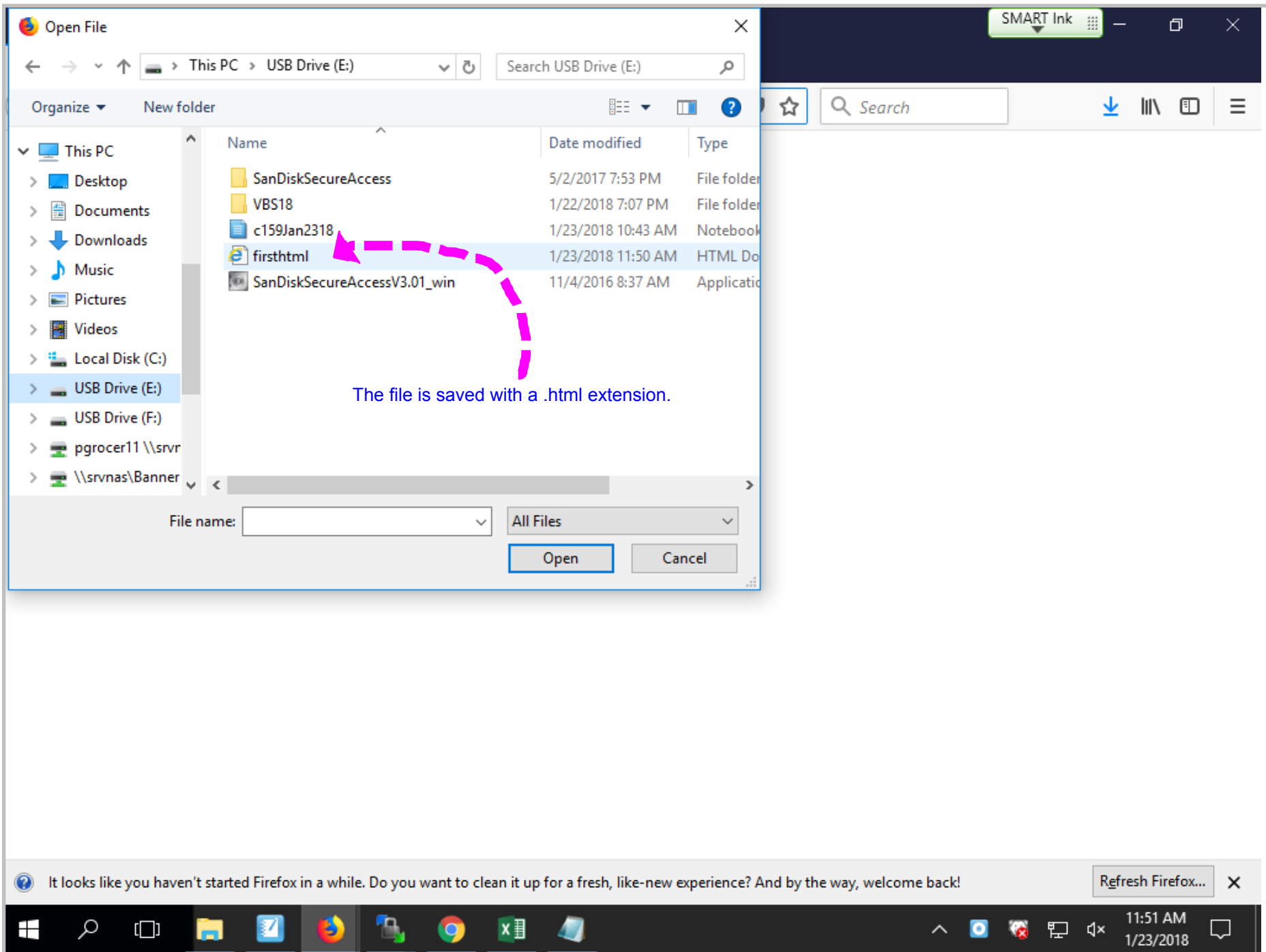
